PATRICIA JOHNSTON 2021 FOCUS ARTIST

Patricia Johnston has lived and worked in Camden since 1959 and her work is inspired by its pastoral landscape.

Johnston's early training began with Barbara Romalis in Wedderburn, and later she learnt under the tutelage of Alan D. Baker as part of the Camden Art Group.

Johnston states that Baker *"revealed the challenge of capturing changing light conditions in open-air painting. The immediacy of this technique and the ability to analyse complex visual scenes established a groundwork that has greatly influenced my painting. The environment became my studio. I also experimented with watercolour and found this the perfect medium when travelling."*

Her formal studies as an artist include a Diploma from the Royal Art Society of NSW, 1987, and a Diploma of Fine Arts from Campbelltown TAFE majoring in printmaking in 2007. Patricia has the highest recognition as a Fellow of the Royal Art Society of NSW, awarded in 1998.

She has won many awards, exhibited in numerous group exhibitions, and

has had 6 exhibitions as a solo artist, including one in California, USA. In 2012 Johnston won first prize for the watercolour *White roses*, a study of white on white, at the Combined Art Societies of Sydney exhibition, Darling Harbour. Again in 2020 she won First prize in the watercolour section for *Gum Blossoms*.

Johnston has tutored in Tuscany, Italy and locally at Art Societies in Scone, Bowral District, Central Coast, Wollondilly and Fairfield. For 15 years Johnston has lead art and cultural tours to Europe and combines her love of travel with watercolour studies done on site.
